Education Team Update

VSAC's education team continues to support youth in schools through our Healthy Relationships and Consent workshops, as well as our Safer Spaces program for adults who work with youth. This year, the pressing issue of addressing sexual assault in schools has gained traction from a series of student protests and school walkouts in the Langford school district SD62.

VSAC has supported the healing process through a series of conversations with youth involved in the protests as well as parents and school administrators. The education department offered recommendations for schools to update their policies. In particular, to reflect the needs and experiences of survivors, and to increase access to resources for support and healing. Program coordinator Allison Macrae provided comment for a pair of CBC radio stories covering the protests and VSAC's involvement.

- The Gender Diverse SART Committee is a group of SART Volunteers who do not identify with the gender they were assigned at birth, this space is for them to create community, support each other, and provide feedback on the program if they would like.

We talked about how gender diverse people are often not seen, acknowledged, celebrated in their life time, and only when they die does the world recognize them.


